Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Members,

This year we are celebrating 50 years of land protection! The work of the Beaufort County Open Land Trust is all around us. As you drive over the Broad River Bridge and look out over Lemon Island, you don't see hundreds of rooftops. Instead you see miles of marsh and those quintessential lowcountry hummock islands, none of which will ever be developed. When you drive down Carteret Street, rather than multistory homes or office buildings at Bellamy Curve you have a breathtaking view of the Beaufort River. Beyond those properties that you helped purchase to protect our views and sense of place are the 25,000+ acres of private land that are protected forever through conservation easements. These conservation easements prevent inappropriate large scale development, provide us with road and river buffers, protect and enhance water quality, provide wildlife habitat and help sustain South Carolina's thriving agricultural and timber industries.

Beaufort has so much to be proud of when it comes to protecting what we love. We have a community that takes great pride and effort in protecting our unique and critical places. But our world is changing quickly and the role of land protection has never been more important. The growth brought on by the pandemic is unprecedented and we must continue to do everything we can to protect what we have because once it is gone, we don't get it back. New Property: Holly Hall Plantation, Lady's Island

Earlier this year, the Open Land Trust was honored to accept a conservation easement transfer from The Nature Conservancy on 518 acres located in the heart of Lady's Island. Holly Hall Plantation has been protected since 1991 and has been stewarded by The Nature Conservancy. The Open Land Trust is excited to add this pristine property to its array of protected lands in and around Beaufort County.

Holly Hall is currently managed for wildlife, recreation, and timber production. Approximately 16% of the property is set aside for rural preservation, 11% of the property is agriculture open space, and the remaining 73% of the property is actively managed timberland. The conservation easement contains three diked fresh-to-brackish water impoundments that are best described as types of tidal freshwater marsh communities featuring rushes, sedges, grasses, and cattails. These impoundments and surrounding brackish marshes are used heavily as feeding areas for herons, egrets, wood storks, and ospreys. The property features over 4 miles of river frontage enhancing public views from the Morgan River, Point Creek and Rock Springs Creek thus also protecting and enhancing the overall water quality.

Celebrating 50 Years of Land Protection

50 years ago, the Beaufort County Open Land Trust was founded so citizens who cared about preserving the spectacular scenic vistas that define Beaufort County would have a non-profit organization dedicated to raising funds to protect key parcels of land from development. Since 1971, the Open Land Trust has grown to protect over 25,000 acres in seven counties.

Festivities began on May 1, 2021 with **Brunch on the Bluff** — on the Bay Street site where it all began. The year-long party continues with a **Chicken Salad Lunch series**, the ever-popular **Auldbrass Tours** in November and the full year will wrap with a **Chef's Dinner series at Widgeon Point** in April of 2022.

As Beaufort continues to grow, and as environmental pressures increase, the leadership role of the Open Land Trust will be more important than ever.





Chicken Salad Lunches

In the early days, members of the Trust did everything they could think of to raise money, including selling potholders on Bay Street and hosting luncheons for tour groups in private historic homes. The luncheons featured the "Hot Chicken Salad" that is in the Open Land Trust cookbook, *Sea Island Seasons*. Unlike today's popular cranberry chicken salad, the Open Land Trust chicken salad featured crushed potato chips! An army of faithful volunteers made sure that the luncheons happened every Spring and Fall for over 25 years. The funds raised helped protect Bay Street Bluff, Bellamy Curve and Lemon Island.

The concept was simple and the fundraising effort was extremely successful! As we celebrate 50 years, we are bringing back this successful tradition of Open Land Trust Luncheons. There is no better way to raise awareness and fundraise, than (safely) with friends at your home.

Census Data Highlights THE URGENCY OF LAND PROTECTION

The South Carolina lowcountry is home to one of the most charismatic landscapes in America – and also one of the fastest growing. In fact, the 2020 census showed growth across South Carolina at 10.8% over ten years: Beaufort and Jasper topped that with 18.4% and 21.3% growth respectively.

From the 2020 Census, we know that coastal development is outpacing non-coastal development, that more land is being used per person than ever before, and that this means coastal residents are building more, driving more, boating more, and generally using more resources than they were 10, 30 or 50 years ago.

Beaufort County conservation efforts, whether through private conservation easements, the County's Rural and Critical Program, and federal partnerships with the National Park Service, USDA, and Department of Defense to protect land, water and quality of life have been broadly successful. As we look back on our 50 years as a land trust, we must also look forward to what the next 50 years will bring and how land protection benefits the growing population who will share this landscape.

Where we protect land shapes how we grow.


When we protect land on St Helena, we are not just protecting prime farmland and an agrarian economy, we are protecting a rural landscape across Chowan Creek from a burgeoning Lady's Island. We are protecting family land and preventing encroachment from speculative development and an influx from out of region development interest.

When we protect land in Dale, Gardens Corner, and Sheldon, we are supporting multi-generational families who can stay on their land, raise crops, trees and children underneath military flight space. These properties connect over 300,000 acres in the ACE Basin to the landscapes throughout Hampton and Jasper Counties, all draining into the Port Royal Sound watershed, the next frontier for landscape conservation.

When we protect land in Okatie and in Southern Beaufort and Jasper Counties, we help cement an urban growth boundary for the mushrooming City of Hardeeville and ensure that sprawling residential or commercial development does not jump over the Okatie, New or even Savannah Rivers.

Of course, by protecting land we protect habitat corridors, farms, forests, and water quality. But we can't ignore the impact to people and places: Land protection in the presence of rapid coastal development is a growth management solution, helping to contain cities and towns and hopefully forcing better development patterns within those communities.

In Beaufort County, we're proud of a successful history of protection of watershed views and vistas — from Bay Street Bluff, Bellamy Curve and Oyster Factory Park — that have shaped our communities and identity. But we also set our sights on the future of land protection throughout the Port Royal Sound region, bifurcated by the Broad River — an area that represents the next piece of our large coastal greenbelt and a key asset to our ability to preserve water quality and our quality of life. These successes and potential converge here, and the recent growth only adds urgency to our pursuit.

In response to rapid growth and several new housing developments, over 13,000 acres were protected in the Ashley River Corridor in the early 2000's. Without strategic land protection, the encroaching suburban development would overwhelm cultural resources like Drayton Hall and the Ashley River itself.
